Richard Milhollin, a long-time leader of the Mark Twain Quail Forever Chapter passed away on May 7, 2014. Richard had a passion for quail hunting and bird dogs. Richard believed in our youth and felt that their success was the key to the future of wildlife conservation and of organizations like Quail Forever.

Since Richard's death, other long-time members of Mark Twain Quail Forever have also sadly passed away. To honor all of these members and their past support, the Mark Twain Quail Forever Chapter sponsors the Mark Twain Quail Forever Conservation Legacy Memorial scholarships each year. Scholarship recipients are selected from area high schools based on their future field of study and understanding of the importance of soil, water, and wildlife conservation.

This is a **\$500** scholarship paid in the first two semesters of college (\$250 each semester) and is made payable to the college to be used for books or tuition. The Mark Twain Quail Forever scholarship committee will review the applications and select the best candidates. Verification of enrollment will need to be provided prior to receiving the award.
